Body Prayer, pt 3 Why do we stand up to face the Gospel book?

During the Eucharist service there is a procession into the center of the congregation with a deacon or priest carrying a book with a red and gold cover. Inside the book are passages from the four Gospels. The procession signifies that the Gospel is at the center of our life as a

faith community, and also signifies that we are to carry the Gospel out into the community. On some Sundays, the Gospel Procession is led by torch bearers with candles. The two lights are both a token of joy and a symbol of Christ, the light of the world.

Wherever we are seated in the church, it is appropriate for us to stand up as we are able, and turn to face the Gospel book as a sign of reverence and respect. This is also an echo of the Jewish practice of carrying the Torah – the first five books of the Bible – into the congregation as a sign of veneration.

Here at St. Benedict's, the Gospel book is located on the Credence Table at the south side of the room. So if you are seated in the pews on the south side, you should turn around to face the Gospel book when the priest or deacon goes by as the procession begins, and keep facing it as it is brought forward. Those on the north side just face the procession from across the room.

It is one of several parts of the liturgy in which we are invited and encouraged to 'embody' our worship – to move and shift and use our physical being in engaging the spirit in more than just words.
