Saint Benedict's Day

Today we honor **Benedict of Nursia**, our patron saint, who is known for his establishment of monastic communities in 6th century Italy centered on living a life of work and prayer, balanced by moderation compassion and mercy.

His *Rule of St. Benedict*, written to show how to live this balanced life, is still used today to inspire Christians' spiritual journey.

Yellow is the liturgical color we use on Saint Benedict's Day because, in the Sarum Rite (Salisbury) tradition, it is used to commemorate an Abbot or Confessor.

St. Benedict's Church in Los Osos was established in July 1987 as a Bishop's Congregation of the Diocese of El Camino Real.

All Saints' Day Necrology

St. Benedict's will be observing All Saints' Day on Sunday, November 3rd. In church tradition, names of parishioners and loved ones who have died are read as part of the Eucharist that day. The Safe Parking Program hosted by Los Osos Cares will begin tomorrow night at the Los Osos Library. This program authorizes people who live in their vehicles to park overnight at the library parking lot from 9pm to 7am. Volunteers monitor the arrivals in the evening, seeing that the lot is ready for our guests and then checking in the

participants, making sure they have the required permits and that they are parking in the designated spaces. In the morning, volunteers check to see that the guests have left by 7am and that the lot is empty, all trash has been picked up, and the porta-potty has been cleaned. First Saturday Series: An Introduction to Bede Griffiths, Benedictine Yogi

November 2nd, 9:30am-12:30pm at St. Ben's

Bede Griffiths (1903-1993), was a remarkable Christian who lived in South India for nearly 50 years. Griffiths sought the divine presence in a personal journey that began at Oxford University, continued to ordination as a Benedictine monk, and ended at an ashram in the Tamil region, where he spent nearly 50 years developing an interfaith dialogue between Christianity and Hinduism. Griffiths was a major spiritual leader in the Indian Christian Ashram movement which sought to reconcile the two faiths. He utilized the theory of integral thought, developed in the early 1970's, that places seemingly separate paradigms into an interconnected whole. For Griffiths, Western science, Eastern mysticism, and Christian faith were totally compatible.

Please join Jerry Walton M.S.; M. Div. for a documentary film followed by an introduction to Bede's writings to explore this important contribution to Christian thought and practice.
