St. Benedict's Hollister Institute is a series of classes, book studies, and programs on a variety of topics which offer opportunities for stimulating discussion and thoughtful exploration for everyone, whether or not they are members of a church. New programs for 2020 begin with a book discussion on the climate crisis:

Climate Church / Climate World

Thursdays, January 9 through February 6. 10:00am – 12:00pm (starting date subject to change)

EarthCare, St. Benedict's environmental advocacy group, presents a study based on Jim Antal's book <u>Climate Church</u>, <u>Climate World -- How People of Faith</u> <u>Must Work for Change</u>. Each session offers a short summary of Antal's ideas, together with questions and activities to help us grapple with the climate crisis in a new way.

Environmental leader Rev. Jim Antal from the United Church of Christ calls climate change " the greatest moral challenge humanity has ever faced. " He presents a compelling case that it's time for the church to meet this challenge, just as the church addressed previous challenges such as slavery and civil rights.

Antal calls for the church to embrace a new vocation so that future generations might live in harmony with God's creation. He suggests practical ways that Christians can reorient what they prize through new approaches to worship, preaching, witnessing and other spiritual practices that honor creation and cultivate hope.
