Sip or Dip, but don't get your fingers wet!

We use a common chalice as a symbol that we are all one in the communion of the saints and members of one Body of Christ.

Research has shown that very few germs are transmitted through the common cup. This is probably because (1) the alcohol kills some (2) we wipe it after each sip and (3) metal does not harbor germs. You are more likely to get someone else's germs by passing the peace or touching a hard surface. Yet it often feels safer and even a gift to your friends to dip your wafer in the wine. BUT, and this is a big but, if you dip too far and get your fingers in the wine you've just contaminated it for all of us. Please, please, please, if you *intinct* (church word for dip) don't intinct your fingers, just the wafer, then we'll all be safer. You may also receive just with your eyes, by crossing your arms over your chest when the cup comes by and physically receiving only the bread.
